IGKT 2025 Half-yearly meeting, 3rd, 4th and 5th October

Venue – Caygill Rooms, The Piece Hall, Blackledge, Halifax HX1 1RE, UK

Friday 3rd October

The Caygill Rooms are on the first floor (lift & stairs access) and will be available from **09:30** for setting up exhibition tables etc.

Vehicle entry to the Piece Hall is in the road called Blackledge, on the south side of the Hall. See accompanying map.

There is space for ropewalks in the entranceway to the rooms and plenty of space outside, given good weather

11:00 to 13:00 Talks and presentations

There is a café on the ground floor, below the Caygill Rooms, for refreshments during the day and many other places in the Westgate area on, surprisingly, the west side of the Hall.

14:00 - 16:00 The Calderdale Industrial Museum adjoins the Piece Hall and we have arranged a special visit to this excellent guide to the important woolen spinning and weaving industries. These made this part of Yorkshire very wealthy during the 150 years from 1800 - 1950. The cost for this visit is £10.

Evening social meeting – many suitable venues in the Westgate Arcade.

Saturday 4th October

10:00 – 16:00 Exhibitions open to the public

16:30 Raffle – please bring a prize or two!

19:00 for 19:30 Buffet supper at a local Thai restaurant renowned for super food.

This is Pajeree's and is about ten minutes' walk from the Hall. The address is 37 Broad Street, Halifax, HX1 1YA. A walking route from the Piece Hall is shown on the attached Walking Map.

Sunday 5th October

10:00 – 13:00 Exhibitions open to the public. Takedown follows.

Vehicles can use the south entrance, as on Friday.

Suggested visit at **13:00**, **14:00** or **15:00** to the nearby (1.5 miles) Shibden Hall. This wonderful 15th century building has a terrific collection of important furniture from 16th century onwards. It was the setting for the BBC series about one of its 19th century owners, Ann Lister, *Gentleman Jack*. The visit costs Adults £10, Over 65s £7.50.

As this is written (Aug 12th) there are 50 tickets available at each of the three times.

Halifax is a town of about 90,000 and is easily accessible by road from the M62 motorway.

2026 IGKT October Meeting dates TBC (maybe September, Turku is at 60° North!)


We very much hope that we shall able to visit Turku in Finland for this annual event.
